- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

Governance Arrangements

The Governing Board of Reeth Community Primary School and Gunnerside Methodist (Voluntary Controlled) Primary School Federation was reconstituted in November 2018 and is now made up of:

The full Governing Board meets on 8 occasions during the school year (3 meetings autumn and spring term, 2 meetings summer term). Each term one of the meetings has an 'Improvement Focus' one has a 'Resource Focus' and the third is an all-encompassing Monitoring & Evaluation meeting. At the initial meeting of the school year Brenda Price continues as Chair and Keith Webster and Richard Sharp continue as Vice-Chairs. The Governors have a broad range of skills and expertise which they bring to their roles and also take responsibility for monitoring an aspect of the School Development Plan.

The work we have done as a governing body – 2022/2023

Reeth and Gunnerside Schools were inspected jointly by OFSTED in March. Both schools continue to be good, and received reports full of complimentary comments about teaching, the behaviour of the pupils and the excellent management of the schools. The high aspirations of governors, and their commitment to consider staff workload and wellbeing were recognised as strengths. Governors were praised for being a very supportive team with one of the largest attendances for a meeting with the inspection team. The governors are delighted by the outcome, and relieved on behalf of all the staff who could finish the year focusing on their important work.

The governors increase their insight into the work of the school through classroom visits and discussions with teachers and pupils. These visits facilitate monitoring of components of the school development plan (SDP), a document that sets out the priorities, actions and targets needed to secure continued progress and growth. A key component of the SDP is improving the 'Quality of Education', and a series of monitoring activities were arranged to evaluate the actions detailed in the plan. Early in the year Mike visited lessons where 'Little Wandle' was used to teach reading through the use of phonics. Richard used a book scrutiny of all classes and subjects to look at 'Writing in depth across the curriculum', Reverend Melanie Reed investigated 'Long-term learning', and Sadie and Richard discussed 'Learning to learn' with pupils. Based on our observations and Mr Stainsby's discussions with staff, the relevant section of the SDP is graded using a traffic light approach according to the progress in that area. Sadie has continued to oversee Special Educational Needs with the SENCO, and has worked closely with leaders to review and refine school systems in recent months.

It is often the unpredictable events that take up a lot of additional time and energy for a Head of school and to some extent the governing team too. There is always the important ongoing work associated with safeguarding, and this year the additional load of dealing with an oil leakage that started during the Christmas holidays. A team of governors have been involved in meetings at school with the contractors and the local authority, the aim being to resolve the incident as effectively as possible for the school, landowners and the environment.

Governors have been involved in the planning phase of two building projects that have been completed over the summer holiday. A large canopy has been built in the orchard at Reeth School, providing an all-weather outdoor learning area for the youngest pupils in Early Years. At Gunnerside School, the Year 5&6 classroom has been extended, creating a much improved learning environment.
