Communication and Language

Literacy

Our Reception children will start on their reading journey and begin learning phase 2 sounds following the Little Wandle phonics scheme.



Our Nursery children will develop their speaking and listening skills through a range of activities, music making, rhymes and songs.

Mathematics

Our learning will see us exploring the early maths concepts of sorting and matching, exploring patterns, and the beginnings of the number system.



Our number work will focus on consolidating the key skills of counting, comparing, subitising and representation, beginning with the smaller numbers.

Understanding the World

We will talk about how we have changed since we were babies and who our family are.

As part of our learning about seasons, we will find out about autumn and what changes it brings. We will investigate how animals begin to get ready for winter and which animals hibernate or migrate. We will explore the different fruits and vegetables that are harvested at this time of year we will find out about Harvest celebrations as well as the festival of Diwali.

Expressive Arts and Design

Our theme of Autumn will provide lots of opportunities for creating artwork, such as apple printing, leaf art, and observational drawing of birds as well as different fruit and vegetables.



We will also make clay Diya lamps to celebrate the festival of Diwali and create colourful patterns linked to Bonfire Night.
