#### The work we have done as a governing body – 2021/2022

Governors meetings have this year returned to face to face meetings. The Chair of Governors (Brenda Price) has once again been particularly involved in school leadership, working with Mr Stainsby to make strategic decisions. The continued healthy numbers of pupils at the schools has enabled governors to support the decision to continue with the five class structure, adding to the valuable work done over this year to reduce the impact of lockdown on pupil progress.

Over the past few years Mr Stainsby has worked hard on combining the school's development plan (SDP) and self-evaluation document (SEF) into one working document that evolves over the years as the needs of the school change. In the document a series of actions are set, what their impact might be, the staff that are responsible for these actions and the governor(s) responsible for observing and monitoring progress. These follow up visits by governors are an important and rewarding part of our work that complement the regular meetings we attend. I imagine that visits by governors may seem onerous for teaching staff, however I would like to reassure the staff team that our role is only to provide evidence for the SEF/SDP rather than a management role. Consequently, on behalf of the governors, I would like to thank all staff for taking the time to prepare for our visits. I have been made very welcome in school and really enjoy the insight into school life. Finally, without exception, what we observe is a calm, busy environment where pupils are very safe and able to make great progress. Children can't hide the truth, and my favourite parts of the visits are the question and answer sessions with them. They are very communicative and complimentary about their school, and they are also very honest when things aren't happening (yet).

The school has achieved a good attendance over the year (94.7%), in the context of a year of increased absence due to of COVID. While it might appear from the outside that school-life has returned to normal, this is far from the truth. It has been a very challenging year for the school, as staff have worked way over and above to try to address the enormous impact of the long lockdowns and periods of home-learning on pupil progress. The year ahead (2022-2023) will brings its own set of challenges, with the prospect of a large chunk of the schools budget looking likely to be required for electricity and heating. Additionally, we have the prospect of academisation, since the government has mandated that all schools will be academies over seen by a multi- academy trust (MAT) rather than a local education authority by 2029.

We would all like to thank Ian-Rowland Hill for his valuable input to the school as a parent governor. Unfortunately for us his time of service has ended.
