PUPIL PROGRESS and LITERACY FOCUS

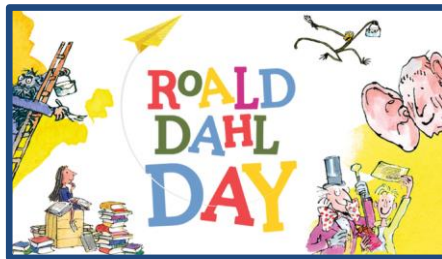
We monitor the learning and progress made by pupils carefully and are very pleased with the outcome of summer term assessments across our schools. A good example of this is the great progress made by our Year 6 leavers, that was significantly above the national average in all subjects. We are ambitious in wanting every child to achieve their very best and have identified literacy as a subject that we plan to focus on in the year ahead. Spelling, reading comprehension and handwriting are aspects of literacy that we are working hard on. We really value the contribution that parents make to learning; reading at home, supporting the learning of spellings and practising handwriting all make a big difference that we see and value on a daily basis. In school this week we have been talking to the children about the importance of these aspects of school life and would appreciate your support in ensuring that your child completes the following activities each week:

- Literacy and numeracy homework
- At least four reading sessions, either with an adult or independently, with progress recorded at the back of the purple home school books.
- Daily practice of spellings and number facts. A daily review of this learning, often is most useful, helping pupils to remember much more in the long term

AFTER SCHOOL COLLECTION ARRANGEMENTS



The safeguarding of the children in our care is something which we naturally place great importance on and we are keen to help you with your after school collection arrangements.

In the absence of any additional information from parents we would expect children either to be collected by their own parents or travel on the home-school transport route notified to us by County. Please let us know in advance about any home-time arrangements which differ: for example, tell us if your child has permission from you to walk home unaccompanied on certain days, or every day; if your child is going to attend dance or another club straight from school; if your child is going to be collected by someone other than yourself; if your child is not going to travel on home-school transport; if your child is not going to return on the inter-site transport to their home-school. **A reply slip is included at the end of this communiqué for regular arrangement details. We need one returned to the school office by every family as soon as possible so that we are certain of the current arrangements for every pupil.** If you need to let us know about an occasional arrangement please try and let us know no later than 3pm so that staff have adequate time to pass on messages. Thank you.

MEDICAL AND TELEPHONE CONTACT INFORMATION FOR YOUR CHILD



A sheet of personal information that we currently hold in school for your child has been sent home to you today. **Please check the information, make any necessary amendments on the form, and then sign and return it to us by the end of next week.** Please remember to update school if there are any changes to your child's medical details or contact information so that we always have the correct information if we need to contact you in an emergency.

HOUSEKEEPING

In order to maintain a tidy school and to reduce loss of personal belongings we ask that all pupils:

- Leave pencil cases at home (these can be used to store equipment for homework instead).
- Use a small drawstring bag to store their PE kit.
- Avoid bringing a large bag for items such as their reading book – a school book bag or similar small bag is more than adequate.
- Name all items of clothing.

BIRTHDAY CAKES AND SWEETS

We have a number of pupils and staff members with significant food allergies. In order to safeguard against a reaction and to comply with the School Food Standards, we ask that when celebrating birthdays, and at any other time, pupils do not bring in food to share with their class. Thank you for your support with this.

INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS

MID-MORNING BREAK TIME SNACK

Please note that snacks other than fruit must not be brought for break-time.
