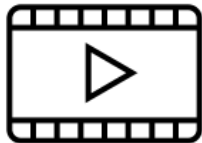
MANAGING HOME LEARNING

We realise that home learning is challenging at times. If you get behind with the work, please don't think that you need to catch up with every task. Instead, it would be better to leave these activities and move on to the most recent work. Learning does tend to follow a sequence, and it can be difficult to get started on some of the lessons if a pupil has missed out some of the earlier work. If this is the case for your child, **please contact school so that we can help**. If you are finding it hard to fit everything in, it's better to do something than nothing at all. This will help your child to feel that they are keeping up and maintaining a routine; completing the work each day will then seem more achievable. Knowing when to stop is important too. We recommend that pupils do not exceed the time that they would have spent studying at school.
