OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Pupils in both Key Stage 1 & 2 have enjoyed programmes of outdoor education in recent weeks. Year 1 and 2 have been canoeing, climbing and orienteering with Marrick Priory. They have also tried archery and have started to learn some bushcraft skills. Their first session was the first day back after half term, and led to some excellent written work in class the following day. The children learned from the experience:


‘I loved it because it made me feel better about the things I can do.’

‘I liked the balance beam because it taught me not to be afraid of heights.’


‘Going across the balance beam gave me confidence to do all my work.’

They had a fantastic week, with an action packed programme that included canoeing, mountain biking, bushcraft, rock climbing, archery, problem solving, a walk through the mine workings of Gunnerside Gill and an overnight bivouac. COVID-19 RULE CHANGES

The government has confirmed that Step 4 of the Roadmap will go ahead on Monday 19th July. When schools return in September, bubbles and distancing will no longer be required and assemblies will be able to go ahead as normal. As our schools are open next week at the start of Step 4, and as pupils are familiar with our current arrangements, we will follow Department for Education guidance, continuing with existing measures until the end of the summer term. An exception to this is that adults on the school site will no longer need to wear a face covering from Monday. Parents are of course welcome to wear a face covering if they choose to do so.


Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

TRANSITION TO NEW CLASSES

Transition to Nursery

We realise that pupils have not benefited from the taster day that we usually provide, but please be assured that each pupil will be well supported as they begin their school journey. We will arrange additional staffing in September to ensure that every pupil can work at their own pace as they grow in confidence and become familiar with the setting.

Transition to Reception

We know that nursery pupils will be looking forward to starting school full time in September. We encourage all pupils to attend full time as soon as possible. If you think that your child would benefit from part time attendance in the first week or two, then please let us know. We recommend completing all five mornings if this is the case, building up to full time by the start of the third week.

Transition to Year 1

On the morning of Monday 19th July, Reception pupils will join Miss Codman in the main school for a taster of life in Year 1.

Transition to Gunnerside

There will be an after school transition opportunity for pupils attending Gunnerside School in September on Monday 19th July at 4pm. Pupils and parents are welcome to attend.

SCHOOL DINNER MENU – AUTUMN TERM

Our school dinners are fresh, nutritionally balanced meals prepared on the premises each day. With the help of the catering team staff, who are keen to work with us to ensure that pupils enjoy their meals, we are continuing to offer a low-sugar home cooked dessert option on most days, as well as fruit or yoghurt. The service, provided by the Local Authority, does have a cost implication for our school, over and above the amount we charge to parents, and we are therefore keen to maximise the number of hot dinners served. We are pleased to continue to subsidise the cost of school meals from

the school budget, enabling the price charged to parents to remain at the current cost of £2.50 per day from September 2021.

We use the 'single choice menu' but there are some small local variances, specific to our schools. A copy of the autumn term dinner menu for each site is being sent home with this newsletter.

SWIMMING LESSONS



As part of the PE curriculum, we plan to resume swimming lessons in September. We have arranged to swim for 6 weeks in the first half of the autumn term, and then for 6 weeks in the second half of the spring term 2022. The lessons will work towards pupils in Year 1 and above achieving a swimming distance of 25 metres, along with acquiring other safety and water skills in preparation for them being able to meet the national curriculum swimming expectations at the end of Year 6. Letters will be sent home towards the end of this term to the pupils involved. Lessons will start on Friday 10th September 2021 for some KS2 children and Tuesday 14th September 2021 for all KS1 children. Pupils will receive approximately 45 minutes of tuition in the pool. We will be using Richmond Swimming Pool for the lessons.

Please note the earlier finishing time of 2.30pm on Friday, 23rd July, the last day of term. Home-school transport will depart from both sites at this earlier time.
