'It was very exciting looking at the badger holes. They are called sets. We saw about 3 or 4 of them. It was a very good walk.'


Jenson

#### CHRISTINGLE SERVICE

Our annual Christingle Service is being held on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December at St. Andrew's Church, Grinton, starting at 1.30pm. Parents and extended family members are very welcome to join us for the service. We expect the service to finish by 2pm. Parents are asked to take their child(ren) home directly after the service and make the most of an early start to the Christmas holiday! We are hoping that everyone will be able to meet this request, or that you will be able to ask a friend or relative to collect your child for you. Please let us know on the SchoolPing reply form included with this newsletter if this is not the case. Transport to the church for pupils will be arranged by the school for pupils in Reception to Year 6. Please complete and return the attached reply slip giving permission for child(ren) to attend the service and indicating travel/collection arrangements afterwards.



We ask for a £1 donation per child to cover the cost of making the Christingle oranges. Please send this to school using the reply slip, or feel free to pop into the office. Any remaining funds will be sent as a donation to the Children's Society. Envelopes to collect donations from family or friends for the Children's Society will be sent home with pupils nearer the time. Please return these envelopes to school by Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December. There will also be a collection plate in aid of the Children's Society at the service.

To ensure safety around lit candles, all pupils with long hair should come to school with their hair tied back. Our younger pupils will be using glow sticks in their Christingle oranges.

#### Nursery aged pupils

Pupils will make Christingle oranges on the morning of the Christingle service. A pack of items will be provided to pupils who don't attend on Friday mornings so that they can make their Christingle at home. Nursery aged pupils are welcome to join us at the Church along with their accompanying adult(s). Collection for nursery pupils who usually attend on a Friday can be at either 12 noon or 12.30pm – please let staff know the arrangements for your child.

#### SPRING TERM SWIMMING

Richmond Pool is anticipating that it will be reopening in the new year (week commencing 9<sup>th</sup> January) following the completion of the building improvement works. We have therefore planned for all pupils in Year 1 and 2, and pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who are still working towards achieving a distance of 25 metres and acquiring other safety and water skills linked to the national curriculum, to re-commence swimming lessons during the spring term as part of the PE curriculum.

For pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 still developing the required skills there will be weekly 1-hour swimming lessons throughout the spring term starting on 13<sup>th</sup> January and continuing until 31<sup>st</sup> March. There will be an assessment prior to February half-term to identify pupils who have met the required standard and are therefore ready to focus on school based PE rather than continuing to swim for the second half of the term.

For pupils in Years 1 and 2 there will be a block of six 45-minute lessons on Tuesday afternoons starting on 21<sup>st</sup> February, after the half-term break, and continuing until 28<sup>th</sup> March inclusive. A further block of six 45-minute lessons has been arranged for Friday afternoons in the first half of the summer term, starting on 21<sup>st</sup> April and continuing until 26<sup>th</sup> May.
