- Our first lines of communication about school closure and school transport in adverse weather are our SchoolPing messaging service and our website, www.reethandgunnerside.org.uk.
- We aim to update the school website by 07:45 each day when conditions are poor. If there is no message on the website, please presume that school is open.
- The most important priority is your child's safety. In school we are not always best placed to know what weather conditions are like where you live. If you decide it is unsafe for your child to travel, please inform us by telephone.
- If you don't have internet access to check the school web-site or view a SchoolPing message, please let us know.
- If a school needs to close during the day, we will contact you by telephone.

Each year the Department for Education set dates for statutory testing and all pupils in certain year groups must be in school to complete these on specific dates. Please find these dates outlined below:

4	Multiplication tables test within the 3-week period from Monday 5 <sup>th</sup> June 2023	
2	KS1 tests administered during May 2023	
1	Phonics tests during week commencing Monday 12 <sup>th</sup> June 2023	

Please note that an extra bank holiday will take place across the UK to mark the coronation of King Charles III next year on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May. Schools will be closed on this day. We await further information from the government and our local authority and will share this with you as soon as possible.
