


FRIENDS OF SCHOOL BAKING STALL

SUPER WRITING

CHOKING HAZARDS

Our school kitchens, in accordance with guidance, chop food items to reduce the risk of choking. We recommend and ask that packed lunches are prepared like this too, particularly for young pupils in early years.

Large fruits like melon and firm fruits like apple - chop into **slices**



Small round food items including grapes, cherry tomatoes and strawberries - chop into **quarters**



Vegetables like carrots, cucumber and celery - chop into **narrow batons**
