

CHRISTMAS ACTIVITIES IN SCHOOL

Pupils in our Early Years will be having their Christmas party on the morning of Wednesday 18th December, followed by a party lunch. Reception pupils can come to school in party clothes on this day, and do not need to bring any uniform items. On Thursday 19th December, following the Christmas dinner, pupils in Years 1 to 6 will enjoy Christmas activities in their class settings.

CAROLS AT REETH MARKET AND REETH SHELTERED HOUSING

CHRISTINGLE SERVICE

Our annual Christingle Service is being held on Friday 20th December at St. Andrew's Church, Grinton, starting at 1.30pm. Parents and extended family members are very welcome to join us for the service. We expect to finish by approximately 2pm. Parents are asked to take their child(ren) home directly after the service and make the most of an early start to the Christmas holiday! We are hoping that everyone will be able to meet this request, or that you will be able to ask a friend or relative to collect your child for you. Transport to the church will be arranged by the school for pupils in Reception to Year 6. Please use SchoolPing to give permission and let us know the collection arrangements for your child.



Pupils will make their Christingle oranges on the morning of the service. We request a £1 donation per child to cover the cost of making them. Please send this to school in an envelope, or feel free to pop into the office.

There will be a collection plate in aid of the Children's Society at the service, and envelopes to collect donations from family or friends will be sent home with pupils today. Please return the envelopes to school by Wednesday 18th December.

For safety reasons, all pupils with long hair should come to school with their hair tied back. Our younger pupils will be using glow sticks in their Christingle oranges. A pack of items will be provided to nursery pupils who don't attend on Friday mornings so that they can make their Christingle at home. Nursery aged pupils are welcome to join us at the church along with their accompanying adult(s). Collection for nursery pupils who usually attend on a Friday can be at either 12 noon or 12.30pm – please let staff know the arrangements for your child.

4	Multiplication tables test within the 3-week period from Monday 2nd June 2025
2	Optional KS1 tests administered during May 2025
1	Phonics tests during week commencing Monday 9th June 2025
