# **BATIK ART**

Year 5 & 6 pupils have been busy working on their art project this afternoon.

'First you wax your chosen image, then you dye the first layer. Then you repeat three times (drying in between) to add layers of detail.'

'I've been creating a turtle design. My first layer was yellow dye and then I added some wax details. Next, I added some blue dye. Finally, I created a border before putting on red dye.'

# SCHOOL MEALS

We really value our school kitchen service that enables us to offer freshly prepared and nutritionally balanced meals to pupils each day at both sites. The service, provided by the Local Authority, does have a cost implication for our school, over and above the amount we charge to parents.

Due to the latest increases in the cost of the service from the local authority, the price of a school meal is due to rise in September 2024. Meal prices from the start of the next academic year will be:

- Nursery meal £2.40
- KS2 pupil meal £2.90 (£14.50 per week)

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, will continue to receive free meals under the national universal infant free school meals initiative funded by the Government.
