CATERPILLARS AND BUTTERFLIES, TADPOLES AND FROGS

In early years pupils have been learning about the life cycles of frogs and caterpillars, and have enjoyed reading *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* and *We are the Wibbly* to support their learning. The children have been carefully observing our class tadpoles and are very excited to see that some of them are beginning to grow legs! They can't wait to see how they have changed after half term.



JOHN MUIR WALK - INGLEBOROUGH

Ten pupils completed a 6 mile walk over Ingleborough on Sunday 27th April, enjoying lovely weather and great views. They are walking the Yorkshire Three Peaks as part of the John Muir Award. We worked on navigation and map reading as well as finding time for sandwiches, games and sunbathing. Everyone had a great approach to the challenge and enjoyed spending time together. GUNNERSIDE BECK HABITAT STUDY

Mrs Bastow's class recently completed a stream habitat study with staff from Yorkshire Dales National Park. On the way up Gunnerside Gill, pupils used colour wheels to explore the colours of nature. At the beck, they did kick sampling and used identification guides to discover which species they had found. This information enabled pupils to assess water quality, as some creatures can only survive in clean water. For the second task, they looked at the surrounding area to discover plants and animals. They looked under rocks and used binoculars to look further afield, and did some drawings to record their findings. The class loved exploring and found lots of spiders, ants, ferns, and flowers.



YEAR 3 & 4 DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

As part of their topic on prehistory – the Stone Age to the Iron Age – pupils have designed and built Bronze Age wattle and daub round houses. They created a clay base for their posts which were measured and sawn from longer sections of dowel. Walls were made by weaving willow and other bendy sticks between the posts. Some pupils preferred to use paper straws for the weaving. Despite being quite a tricky task, there was some excellent weaving. The class had to work out how to make the roof frame for the turf roof using only sticks and string. This was very hard, but with perseverance and team work, they did a great job. Pupils have taken home some clay to make a daub for the walls over the half term break.



SCHOOL MEALS

We really value our school kitchen service that enables us to offer freshly prepared and nutritionally balanced meals to pupils each day at both sites. The service, provided by the Local Authority, does have a cost implication for our school, over and above the amount we charge to parents.

Due to the latest increases in the cost of the service from the local authority, the price of a school meal is due to rise in September 2025. Prices from the start of the next academic year will be:

- Nursery meal £2.65
- KS2 pupil meal £3.20 (£16.00 per week)

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, will continue to receive free meals under the national universal infant free school meals initiative funded by the Government.

We are pleased to let you know that we have appointed Mrs Kate Kiernan as our Y5 & Y6 classteacher from September. Pupils participated really well in the lessons that Kate taught this week, and we know that the class will enjoy getting to know their new teacher later this term and in September.


FRIENDS OF SCHOOL BAKING STALL
